#### Call For Art at the Ontario Airport!

CAA member Chris Frausto is co-curator of Art at the Ontario Airport. The program is a collaboration between the Ontario Airport Authority and Chaffey Community Museum of Art. The program brings original visual art created by regional artists into airport terminals to be viewed by up to 6 million passengers annually. Exhibits are within wall-mounted glass display cases inside the airport near terminals, and can accommodate small-scale 2D and 3D artwork. All media is eligible except that requiring electricity. ## **Artist Spotlight %**

Becky Floyd is CAA's 2nd Vice President, webmaster, and social media manager. Her stained glass piece, "Art Nouveau Thistles", won Best of Show in our March 2021 "Botanicals" art show. Becky learned stained glass at CSU Fullerton in the late '90's. Becky took up stained glass as a hobby in 2015 when time and family life finally allowed it. She joined CAA in 2018 to share her art with people who would appreciate it and the technical aspects of her craft, as well as share the creative drive that spurred her on. In 2019, she began helping CAA with their social media publicity, and by early 2020 was voted 2<sup>nd</sup> VP and responsible for all things digital for CAA. Becky's education is in Biological Anthropology, specializing in human skeletal anatomy. She is a full-time college professor in Orange County, though she was born and raised in Corona, CA. She enjoys bringing her first passion, Anthropology, into her artwork, incorporating skulls, primates, science, and other themes related to her field. Finding that her garage workspace is too hot to do stained glass in the summer months, she has branched out into other artforms that can be done indoors, including mosaics and micro-sculpting with polymer clay, which is cured in a home oven. Becky has realized that she most enjoys the tactile and technical nature of stained glass, mosaics, and polymer clay.

Two artists she is particularly drawn to are Louis Comfort Tiffany, who invented many of the techniques employed in modern stained glass, and Gustav Klimt, particularly his 1910 painting, "Death and Life".

She did not consider herself an artist until fairly recently, when she came to the realization that everyone is an artist, they just have to find their medium. For Becky, that's cold glass and hot clay.
